Pastor's Corner August 2024

Like most of you, voting is a privilege that I take seriously. I think I have only missed voting in one election (a primary) since I turned 18 and became eligible to vote. Over the years I have voted for some candidates that won the office they were seeking, and others who did not win the election. Most of you have, too.

My parents both took turns as election workers on Election Day, and they emphasized the importance of studying the issues and the candidates and making the most informed decisions possible when it was our turn to go to the polls.



Most folks are reluctant to talk politics or religion as both can be very "hot button" issues. And mostly, all I say about politics is what I've already said above, with this final word: please vote in November and in as many elections as you can throughout the year.

It is unfortunate that some of the scripture passages from the lectionary recently, and in the weeks ahead, are more political in nature. Of course politics are everywhere, and yes, even in the church. And every time the Pharisees point out things that Jesus and the disciples do, or don't do, there's Jesus standing up and pointing out that maybe the Pharisees aren't as perfect as they claim to be. I invite you to pay attention as we go through these passages as they are enlightening, and thought-provoking. Perhaps we might even try to figure out which side we are on, or which character to whom we most relate.

And isn't that the way some of our current wave of politicians behave? Candidate A says they are high and mighty and Candidate B says, not so fast! Kinda reminds me of kids arguing on the playground at times. Nevertheless, we are the ones who will cast the ballots and we will strive to choose as wisely and carefully as we can.

As we listen to far too many political ads or commercials leading up to Election Day, let us remember that God wants the best for us in every situation, and that God is with us, no matter what.

**Adult Sunday School** is offered every Sunday at 9 a.m. in room 201 (SW corner of the sanctuary.)



**Trash Enclosure:** Let's keep our trash enclosure neat and clean!

- Trash: A reminder that when taking items to the trash enclosure, please be sure that items are placed in the appropriate trash container. There are 3 containers two black containers for regular trash and a blue-topped container for recyclable trash.
  - ⇒ Please DO NOT leave bags laying on the concrete.
- Aluminum cans: The youth continue to collect aluminum cans for the convenience of the congregation and as a money-making project. Youth receive very little for the cans they recycle, about 10 cents per pound, but they continue to collect cans.
  - ⇒ Depending on the time of year, they have enough cans to make it worthwhile to take them to the recycling center. Usually they take them about 4 times a year --more frequently if needed. They make every effort to keep the trash enclosure as neat as possible; but your help is also needed. Place bagged aluminum cans neatly in west corner and side of enclosure.
  - ⇒ Aluminum foil and foil products are no longer recyclable.




