Pastor's Corner July 2025

We blinked and all of a sudden it's almost July! And that means that I will be returning to Pleasant Hill for the coming year. I know that you have been used to a full-time pastor in the past, so this business of a half-time pastor is kind of hard to get used to for some folks. It's a challenge for me also, as I've always been full time, up until now.

How did the church get to this point of only having a half-time pastor? I was not in on that decision, but it seems that this church, like many churches, faced some financial difficulties during the years of the pandemic. Difficult financial decisions needed to be made and this was




a big decision, not taken lightly. With a full time pastor, churches are responsible for not only salary, but also housing, health insurance, pension and a larger travel and professional expense package. With a part time pastor, you are only responsible for salary, housing and some professional expenses and travel. Since I'm retired, my pension and social security make up the balance of income.

So what does that mean to be appointed to a half time position? Well, it means that I work about 20-25 hours a week, and full time would be 40-50 hours a week. As near as I can tell, my main responsibility is worship and preaching, resourcing committees and teams in the congregation, being present or participating in church activities, and some pastoral care. This means it is important for church members to step up and help in as many areas as possible, and thankfully, we have a wonderful group of members who step up and take on some pretty important responsibility.

I tend to focus on worship and preaching, and resourcing committees and other administrative things. There is a group of folks who are excellent at communicating with the congregation through emails, phone calls, prayer chains, etc. The congregational care team is great at sending cards, making calls, and offering to meet needs as we can. There are folks that are really great at taking care of the property needs, fixing and mowing and mulching, among other things. We have folks that help prepare and serve funeral dinners, and folks who tie quilts for the children of the community. There are always places for folks to serve and don't be shy-- feel free to make your wishes known.

I want to be responsive to your needs. All you have to do is let me know. It is fine to let Deb know of prayer concerns, as she always lets me know, and so does Mary. Callahan Davis July 2025



We've been praying for dear baby Callahan Davis. 'Baby Cal' is the son of Raiven and Jacob Davis, the little brother of Elaina, and great grandson of Elaine Worden. Raiven is a member of our church. She was active in our youth group as a teenager, was confirmed in our church in 2007, and remains a member.



For some background, Cal was born at Stormont Vail hospital on April 11. He arrived in the world a bit premature, and in his short life has been the guest of many hospitals. Currently, he is in Wisconsin for medical

his short life has been the guest of many hospitals. Currently, he is in Wisconsin for medical care with expert consultants from around the country.

Cal was born with no trachea. Tracheal Agenesis is the name given to a rare birth defect where the trachea fails to develop. Today Baby Cal is 2 months old. He has had many surgeries, tests and struggles. He has daily PT and OT. He had a feeding tube placed and is now receiving breast milk through his feeding tube. His course of treatment is long and he will probably remain in Wisconsin until next spring.

According to his mom, during this next surgery they will create Cal's 'trach' by bringing his esophagus to the skin. They will also create a spit fistula to collect saliva since his esophagus will be severed from both his stomach and his 'airway'.

The family has been able to stay at the Ronald McDonald house at his current hospital in Wisconsin. Soon that will change. Dad, Jacob, and sister, Elaina, will be returning to Kansas. Raiven will stay with Cal as his medical adventure continues.

The Congregational Care Team will be organizing "happy boxes" for the family. Raiven will be sharing some of their needs and some of their favorites to help them through this time. Our job will be to FILL THOSE BOXES -- a "happy box" for Wisconsin AND for Kansas. We will collect some of those items July 20 and 27 after worship service for our first box. If you care to send a card, you can place it in the box. You may also include a small item to lift their spirits and let them know we are thinking of them and Baby Cal.

2025 Annual Conference Report

The 2025 Great Plains Annual Conference was held June 5-7 at Kansas Wesleyan University in Salina. Theme for the conference was Loving God based on Deuteronomy 6:5. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your being and with all your strength.

A new UMC vision statement was introduced at the conference. "The United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, **love boldly**, **serve joyfully**, and **lead courageously** in local communities and worldwide connections." Each phrase is tied to scripture, we: • Love boldly (Matthew 22:37-39). • Serve joyfully (Psalm 100:1 and 1 Peter 4:10) • Lead courageously (Joshua 1:9) — "The mission of The United Methodist Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

Bishop David Wilson officiated the inspiring and powerful conference. One of the guest speakers was Retired Bishop Gregory V. Palmer who stressed the importance of knowing our community, "We've got this notion that we want to go to church, and we don't want to be disturbed" ... "What if the United Methodist Church said, 'We're gonna love the zip code, and we're going to know everybody by name'?"

In Bishop David Wilson's presentation he reminded us, "We are called to be people who know there is much to do in our communities and in our churches. People need our loving, serving and prophetic voices to know that God is still so ever present. Folks need to know that there is more that we can do, not on our own, but being led by the Holy Spirit. We will do this because of our Love for God that drives us to do all that we do. Like the Exodus story, may we never forget what God has done for us in the past, but more importantly, that God will continue to be so faithful to us for our future."

The Great Plains Conference voted on four proposed amendments to the United Methodist constitution, all of which passed overwhelmingly at the 2020/2024 General Conference. These included:

- ◆ Regionalization Would transform the United States to a regional conference and rename central conferences as regional conferences for United Methodists outside the United States. It puts United Methodists around the world on equal footing by no longer assuming the way the United States "does" church is "normal" and those outside are abnormal. It also allows the United States to adapt the Book of Discipline in certain sections as central conferences have done for many years.
- ◆ Inclusiveness of the Church Adds the words "gender" and "ability" to a list of descriptions to which people will not be measured for being allowed to participate in the full life of the church.
- Racial Justice Adds a statement that racism must be eradicated and that The United Methodist Church commits to doing its part to confront and eliminate racism, racial inequity, colonialism, white privilege and white supremacy in society.
- ♦ Educational Requirements for Clergy Impacting mostly central conferences (outside the United States), this amendment would set minimum education requirements for clergy to be eligible to vote for General Conference delegates.

The vote totals for the Great Plains will not be shared. Our totals were tabulated by our conference secretary and will be sent to the Council of Bishops, where they will be compiled with votes from other annual conferences around the world to see if the two-thirds threshold for each has been met. We may not know the results until late fall of this year.


